

How you can help at home

Reading

Please read as much as possible with your child. Just 10 minutes a day can make a huge difference. Read anything that interests your child. Please don't just read their reading book.

Most children now have a simple book where they are able to practise their new found blending skills. We will be introducing fiction and non-fiction reading books when your child is ready.

Maths

We develop mathematical knowledge and understanding daily through a variety of counting and problem-solving activities. Counting 2 or 3 groups of objects to find a total in and out of the home, e.g. children & adults, cars and vans is a great way to consolidate your child's understanding of number.

Phonics & Spellings

We teach phonics (letter sounds) daily and we use these sounds to sound out simple 3 & 4 letter words such as pit, this, chin, feet, flag, pram. 'I spy' is a great game to play at home.

Number Facts

This term we are working on:

***Recognising numbers to 20.**

***Sequencing numbers to 20 both forwards and backwards.**

***Number doubles 1+1, 2+2**

***Counting in tens**

Please practise these at home as much as possible.

Travelling Bears

Going away? Take one of our travelling bears and take it on holiday. Share with us where you've been and help improve the geographical knowledge of children in Reception.

Handwriting

Now finger control has begun to develop in the majority of children we are expecting children to write their name with correctly formed letters-both capital and lowercase.

Tapestry

Tapestry is an online Learning Journey showing what your child is doing in school and the progress they are making. Mrs Gooding and Mrs Jeffrey update Tapestry as much as busy school life allows. It consists of photographs, videos and comments. Reminders

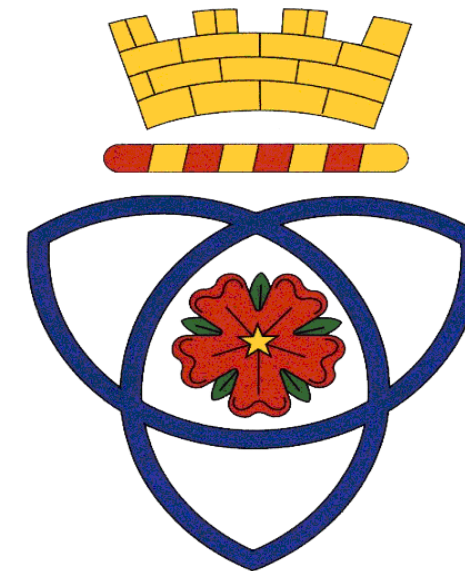
- Our P.E. day is Friday.

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Half Termly Overview

Reception Spring 1 2019

Early morning drop ins start this half term (starting Tuesday 15th Jan). Please join your child in exploring our resources on Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday mornings from 8:45 for just 10 to 20 minutes.



Dear Parents/Carers,

In Reception we do a lot of learning through exploration. Each day we have activities planned to develop your child's knowledge and skills. We try and encourage them to direct the way the topic develops by asking questions that need to be investigated or by demonstrating a particular interest. Your child is encouraged to read, write, count and problem solve on a daily basis through challenges and careful questioning by the staff.

What is cold land like?

Throughout the year we explore different types of environment found around the world. This half term we are looking at cold places. We will kick start the topic through the stories of **Mr Sneeze** and **Say hello to the snowy animals**. Through these stories we explore a cold land environment, friendships, cold land animal facts and shapes.

What is the weather like in very cold places?

Who lives in these cold lands?

How do we keep warm?

Where in the world are the cold lands?

Our Role Play: imagination



This half term we are encouraging the children to be in charge of this area. We will gather their ideas together and then start to develop this area into Cold Land. This gives the children ownership and encourages them to develop their imagination by acting out their story ideas. We make sure instruments, natural materials, fabric and mark making equipment are added alongside resources suggested by the children to develop creativity as much as possible. The other main areas of learning that are developed through this area are physical development, friendship, communication and language.

Our Investigation Area: folding and cutting

will explore folding paper shapes and then cutting smaller shapes out of the folded paper. When we open it up we will have made our very own snowflake.

Our Funky Fingers Area: folding and sticking

We will be wrapping 3D shapes in white paper to make 'snowballs' and then explore which 'snowball' rolls best to knock our penguin skittles down.



Through our topic we are learning to:

Reading

- We will be exploring information/non-fiction texts this half term and comparing them to stories/fiction.

Writing

- This half term we are encouraging the children to write down their ideas be it stories, lists or captions with increasing independence. Mrs Gooding and Mrs Jeffrey will still be working with your child on a one to one basis. As a class we are focusing on writing stories with a simple beginning, middle and end.

Phonics

- We will be recapping on letter sounds of the alphabet and introducing sounds that are written using 2 letters such as ee (feet), sh (shop), ch (chin), th (then), oo (cool), ay (play). We expect the children to use these sounds when reading and writing, increasing their

Exploring media & materials

- We will be exploring how we can fold, cut and join paper to create snowflakes.
- We will be moving materials around to create our own stories in our creative area.
- We will be exploring musical instruments and singing songs as a class and in groups.

Communication & Language

- We will be practising looking at the person talking and remembering to take it in turns to listen and talk.
- We will practise using indoor and outdoor voices in the correct setting.
- We will be talking about things we do at home through Tapestry every Monday.
- We will be adding narratives to our role play.
- We will change our voices through drama sessions and storytelling opportunities.

Maths

- We will be recognising numbers to 20 and beyond, counting forwards and backwards and ordering these numbers. We compare amounts by counting and by sight and use the language of more and less.
- We will be measuring amounts to make play dough.
- We will continue to learn the days of the week through songs and recognising the days are cyclic.
- We will explore and start to name 3D shapes. We will find out which shapes roll and which shapes do not.

The World

- We will be learning about different types of environments.
- We will learn about keeping warm.
- We will be exploring simple maps.
- We will be learning about some of the animals found in cold land.
- Exploring & celebrating Chinese New Year.

Physical

- We will practise being safe whilst using tools, e.g. scissors, Sellotape dispenser
- We will practise undressing and dressing independently for P.E. lessons.

PSED

- We will continue to practise sharing resources with each other and taking turns.
- We will try and keep ourselves and others safe.
- We will be encouraging perseverance.
