




Say 1 more than any given number to 10, say 1 less than any given number to 10.

Play number matching games where your child finds the next or previous number. Use number flashcards to show a number and your child can respond with the next number.

Count to 100.

Encourage your child to count their steps as they walk.

Count in multiples of 10 to 100 forward and backwards.

Your child needs to be able to count in tens forwards and backwards. You could play jumping games where each jump is worth 10. On a journey count a colour of car in tens.

How parents can help at home

Parents can use the questions, answers and ideas below to test the quick mental recall skills your child needs to pass their passport. Children should be able to answer questions quickly, within 5 seconds.

Count and select a set of objects to 5.

Play counting games, ask your child to help with jobs where they have to count objects around the house. Recognise numerals 1-5 (Out of sequence). Show your child numbers and ask them to say the name of the number. Play number spotting games when out shopping. Play number hide and seek by hiding different numbers around the house or garden. Compare 2 sets of objects and find the set that has more or less. At home compare things around the house. At meal times compare items of food on plates.

Use your fingers to make any given number to 10 without counting.

Play quick fire games with hands behind their back, give your child a number and ask your child to quickly show you the correct numbers of fingers without having to count.

Count 1-20 forwards and backwards.

Play counting games. Count how many steps it takes to get to the car and count backwards how many steps it is back home.
