



Half-Term Curriculum Overview



Year 6 Spring 2 - 2016

English

- **Reading:** understand, describe, select or retrieve information, events or ideas
Deduce, infer or interpret information, events or ideas from texts.
Explain and comment on writers' use of language.
- **Writing:**
To identify the features of a narrative
To explore character and setting introduction.
To explore with the arrangement of paragraphs
To experiment with description, dialogue and action.
To be able to build-up to a problem and resolution
To be able to write an effective ending.
- **Spelling, punctuation and grammar.**
To spell words with common patterns.
To identify, recognise & use subordinate clauses and different word classes correctly.

Mathematics

- To solve multi-step problems involving fractions and percentages, using calculators when appropriate.
- To mentally calculate using decimals and integers
- To use efficient written methods involving whole numbers and decimals
- Use approximations, inverse operations and tests of divisibility to estimate and check results
- To show a large whole number as a fraction or percentage of a smaller one
- To recognise equivalent fractions, decimals and percentages
- To simplify fractions
- To create common denominators
- To recognise one fraction as part of another one.

Science – Where do we come

- Interdependence and adaptation.
- To recognise that a green plant needs light and water to grow well.
- To compare and contrast how animals in two habitats are suited to their environment
- To represent feeding relationships in food chains
- To use the vocabulary of producer, predator and prey.
- To produce material for new growth from air and water in the presence of light
- To understand where plants come from and how they're made.

Homework

- **Learning Logs:** Children choose a *minimum* of 5 activities to complete over the term. The learning log is to be returned to school on the final week of the term. However, teachers may ask children to bring them in at regular intervals to check progress children are making.
- **Maths:** mymaths.co.uk homework for pupils in Y2 – 6 is to be completed weekly.
- **Spellings:** A test each **Friday** and new spellings to be learnt given out on a **Monday**.
- **Reading:** To be practiced regularly. Books are changed when necessary.

History / Geography – Who changed Brazil?

- To identify and compare Brazil on a map
- To understand the varied climate and environment within Brazil
- To compare and contrast living in Brazil with living in England.
- To begin to understand development in the country of Brazil
- To appreciate the culture and lifestyle choices of Brazil
- To understand the effects of tourism and deforestation on the country and its people.
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Computing

- To: plan, develop and evaluate their own game for a specific audience.
- To code a simple program using a text-based programming language.
- To research localities using a digital map and use advanced tools like route finders.

PE

- To play in a team to help and support each other.
- To make a team plan and communicate it to others.
- To use a range of attacking and defending tactics during invasion games. (i.e. basketball & handball).
- To be able to lead others in a game situation.
- To choose appropriate warm ups and cool downs and be able to communicate these to others.

Art / D&T

- To design and create a tropical rainforest.
- To use appropriate materials
- To explore appropriate plants and landscapes.

RE and PSHCE

- To understand the importance of sacred places within the Muslim religion
- To identify and interpret religious symbols and meaning within an Islamic Mosque.
- To understand Islamic pilgrimages.

Music and MfL

- **Music:** To understand beat, rhythm, pitch and dynamics.
- To focus on listening and playing together.
- **Spanish:** To develop sentences using plural and singular nouns.

SMSC

In assemblies we will be discussing themes such as Lent, keeping safe around dogs and why mothers are so special. We will also learn about Holy week and Easter and why this is such an important time in the Christian calendar. All children will take part in an Easter Service. In class they'll be talking about the positives about themselves and others. The whole school will also take part in fundraising activities to raise money for the school and for Red Nose Day. Finally, we will be having a visit from Olympic runner, Tom Lancashire, who works as a 'sportivater' and we'll be able to ask him some questions about what motivates him.
